- To investigate the role of public libraries in supporting students preparing for competitive examinations.
- To suggest recommendation for improving library resources and services.
- To Identify the availability and adequacy of library resources (Books, journals, online databases, etc.) for competitive exam preparation.

(4) Research Tool:

Questionaries method was employed for data collection. In the present study a self-made google form questionaries structured for data collection.

(5) Scope & Limitation:

- Geographil scope south Gujarat. The scope of the present study is limited to students preparing for competitive examinations of south Gujarat.
- Population scope students preparing for competitive examinations
- Male and female students are included in this study.
- The Present study is limited to students preparing for competitive exams only.
- This study is limited to one area so the findings of this study can not be applied to the whole state, all district or state equivalent.

(6) Review of Literature:

Relevant studies in the area of information sources and services for competitive exams were reviewed for the study.

- Ramesh, Ananda A. & Kumar, Kishor S (2016) in their study found that 22% are visiting the public library for competitive exam preparation
- Baladhandayutham, A & Murugapandi, V (2015) Suggests that majority of the users visits the central library to prepare for competitive exams and concludes that library provides resources related to competitive examination to the user and lots of the users of the public library gets job opportunities through this central library.
- Koovakkai, Dineshan & Jalaja, V (2006) in their analysis identities that there is a significant difference in level of requirement of resources to prepare for competitive examinations among female and the male career seekers, whereas there is no significant difference in level of requirement of electronic resources among them.
- Durrance, Joan. C (1991) points out that the role of the Libraries is not Simply providing the resources needed by the users rather they also should know how the users utilize the library career resources and services.

(7) Research Methodology:

An Analytical study was conducted through a primary survey. In the present study a survey method was used and a self-constructed questionnaire was designed to answer specific questions. So that information can be collected by getting specific answers based on the objectives for the present study the information has been obtained from the students preparing for the competitive examinbations either face to face or indirectly through the medium of questionnaires.

(8) Data Analysis and Interpretation:

For this study, a total of 50 questionnaires were distributed to students preparing for competitive

examinations in south Gujarat areas. Out of 50 questionnaires I jave received 41 (80%) questionnaires with the proper answer. Out of 100%i have received 81% of questionmaires. It was sufficient population to carried research work.




Figure 8.1 Gender of respondents




Figure 8.2 Age Information




Figure 8.3 course of study




Figure 8.4 residence

5. for which of the following competitive exams you are preparing? 41 responses




Figure 8.5 following competitive exams




Figure 8.6 motivated prepare detail

7. What language newspaper do you read? 40 responses




Figure 8.7 Languages

8. through which source normally you used to get the information 41 responses




Figure 8.8 Sources used




Figure 8.9 Undergoing training for competitive exams




Figure 8.10 weekly time spend detail

11 .how frequent you visit this public library to prepare for competitive exams ? ^{39 responses}




Figure 8.11 visit library

12.what type of books you are reading for competitive exam preparation? 41 responses




Figure 8.12 Types of books reading




Figure 8.13 magazines reading




Figure 8.14 read general magazines

15. Based on the above listed resources (Books, Magazines and Newspaper) usage, what is your Level of Utility of Competitive Exam Resources in this Library?




Figure 8.15resources in library

16. Which of the following resources are available in libraries?




Figure 8.16 resources in libraries

17. Which of the sources do you use frequently for your competitive examinations? 41 responses




Figure 8.17 sources frequency




Figure 8.18 useful sources

19. Name the competitive examinations faced by you




Figure 8.19 name of competitive exams

20. Are digital resources are more useful than hard copies for preparing competitive examinations? 41 responses




Figure 8.20 digital resources useful detail
